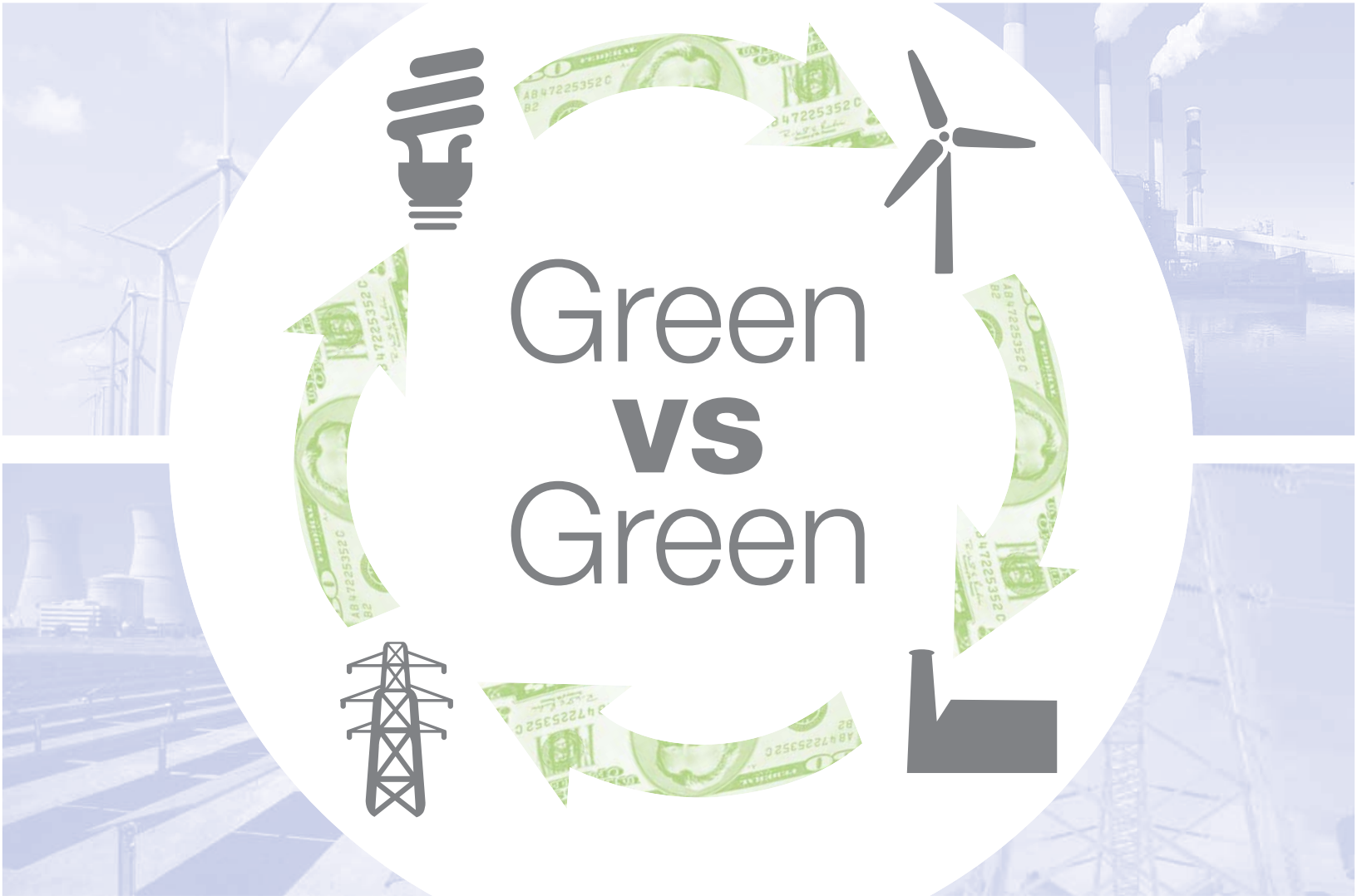

Typically 1.0 PDH is equal to .1 CEU, but you should always verify the conversion scale.

#### Art Gallery and Park Tour

DeGrazia's Gallery in the Sun is a celebration of the American Southwest's native people, history and culture. The gallery and his home, designed by the artist himself, Ettore "Ted" DeGrazia, consists of a group of low slung adobes that offer exhibits of his earliest and latest works. You will immediately recognize the works of DeGrazia, who is one of the world's most reproduced artists.

There are six permanent collections of paintings that trace historical events and native cultures of the Southwest. Rotating exhibitions display some of the 15,000 DeGrazia originals housed at the gallery, including oils, watercolors, sketches, serigraphs, lithographs, sculptures, ceramics and jewelry. A consignment room displays DeGrazia originals available for purchase, while the gift shop offers a wide selection of reproductions.

Next, guests will visit Tohono Chul Park, recently chosen as one of the ten great botanical gardens in the world. This 49-acre Tucson oasis contains nature trails, art exhibits, demonstration gardens, museum shops, greenhouse, and a Tea Room. You will enjoy a docent guided tour which includes an overview of Tohono Chul Park, the Sonoran Desert and the native plants of the area, animals that inhabit the desert and the native people who dwell here. This walking tour covers a one mile loop, with frequent stops at points of interest. Comfortable shoes and sun-screen are recommended.

Following the tour, lunch will be served in the Tohono Chul Park Tea Room. After lunch, visit the Museum Shop well-known for high-quality and authentic gifts and souvenirs.

### **An Effective Model for Regulation of Bulk Power System Reliability**

**Gerry Cauley, President & CEO, North American Electric Reliability Corp.**

NERC exists to ensure the reliability of the power system in North America. As a self-regulatory organization NERC develops and enforces reliability standards for utilities and monitors the power system. This presentation will discuss the direction and goals of the North American Electric Reliability Corporation. NERC's vision is to be the world's leading expert organization on bulk power system reliability risk management, promote compliance excellence and enforce compliance with mandatory reliability standards, and be a trusted leader and advocate in reliability matters.

NERC's plan to achieve this vision will be the primary focus of the presentation. The action plan includes many initiatives, including: rebalancing NERC's role to deliver contributions to bulk power system reliability while maintaining enforcement authority; integrating and leveraging of regional and stakeholder ideas and expert resources to improve reliability; building constructive relationships with FERC, Congress, and other federal, state, and provincial authorities; transitioning reliability standards to be results-based; promoting greater process transparency and consistency; developing event analysis capabilities; developing goals and scope for the physical and cyber security protection of critical bulk power system assets.

### **PacifiCorp Transmission Energy Gateway Update**

**John Cupparo, VP, Transmission, PacifiCorp**

PacifiCorp has taken the lead in developing a robust transmission system which will serve as the backbone for cost-efficient, flexible and diverse resource development while meeting the growing needs of consumers and the requirements of evolving energy policies. In addition, it will provide relief for transmission congestion and improve the flow of electricity throughout the region. PacifiCorp has invested more than \$6 billion to construct approximately 2,000 miles of new high-voltage transmission lines. Construction began in February 2009 and the first segment of the project will go into service in 2010.

The presentation will provide details of PacifiCorp's Energy Gateway project. An overview describing the development of this new transmission resource project and successes and challenges you've had along the way. Sharing the project experiences in permitting, connecting wind farms and renewable resources and working with various entities to complete this massive project. Electric Utilities today are facing numerous pressures, being challenged from all sides. Customers expect high reliability and low costs. Utilities are an integral part of the "home town" and are needed to support a wide range of civic activities. Seasoned employees are ready for retirement and replacements are not interested in utility jobs. Local regulatory and rate making bodies are reluctant to raise rates but demand green and sustainable solutions. National regulatory bodies are indecisive and seem to lack understanding of the real issues and time required to implement solutions. Cost effective technology is not yet ready to address the environmental issues being considered. Investors are concerned about growth, and electric demands have shrunk precipitously during the recession. What things can be done to make that light at the end of the tunnel – the end of the tunnel?

### **Emerging Impacts on the Electric Sector**

**Ken Anderson, Executive VP & GM, Tri-State Generation & Transmission Assn.**

As the most recent round of events ([greening](#), fuel vilification, NIMBY, climate change, to name a few) engulfing the electric sector continues to emerge, a number of business strategies are unfolding. Unfortunately, many of these business strategies seem to be focused extensively on survival and a willingness to forsake affordability of our product.

Maybe Maslow had it right and we all should be in survival mode...but for us in the cooperative movement, we cannot survive if we jettison the consumer at the end of the line (and the commerce and industry that provides those consumers jobs) by ignoring affordability.

Thus, our business strategies are focused on attempting to perfect as many options as we reasonably can to continue to provide long-term affordability of our products and services. To keep many of these options open and viable, it is essential that we find solutions to the "carbon" issue. The constant refrain vilifying coal is soon to shift to vilification of natural gas, so even fuel-switching is at best a short-lived, myopic survival strategy. Other "carbon solutions" too are fraught with peril (liability for sequestration, for example). It is time to challenge our ingenuity and creativity to find real solutions involving carbon and helping keep all fossil fuel options open for long term electricity affordability and quality of life.

### Integrating Wind Generation in the Pacific Northwest

**Stephen Wright, Administrator & CEO, Bonneville Power Administration**

The BPA has had an explosion of wind power development as what was expected to be an aggressive 12-year plan for merchant wind interconnections has been exceeded in only 5 years. With this substantial increase in wind power have come difficult challenges to assure system reliability is maintained and cost consequences are appropriately allocated. BPA is currently providing balancing services to variable energy resources from its primarily hydro-based system (with one nuclear plant) but anticipates the flexibility of that system will be fully utilized in the near future. The BPA Administrator/ CEO will describe the actions being taken to assure reliability is not compromised, and costs are appropriately allocated to beneficiaries in order to allow continued renewable resource development.
